Leave your legacy with FAME

A gift in your will (or Bequest) that benefits a cause you care about deeply is one of the best legacies you can provide.

We all wish for a long and healthy life, but none of us knows what the future will bring. One thing we do know is that many of Australia's unique plants and animals will be lost to the world forever unless we work together to do something about it. Your Bequest to the Foundation for Australia's Most Endangered Species (FAME) Ltd will enable us to respond into the future to the urgent needs of Australian endangered species to save them from extinction.

People making bequests to FAME sometimes tell us they have included a gift in their will to memorialise their family name, their parents or another loved one. However, people making such bequests have all also chosen to help the natural environment – its biodiversity and ecological systems as a whole – to safeguard it for now, and into the future.

This is their legacy.

Leaving a Bequest to FAME

FAME's vision is to prevent any further extinctions of Australia's flora and fauna. Stopping extinctions will ensure that future generations, your children and grandchildren, will not have to view Australian fauna behind glass in a natural history museum. They will be able to see plants and animals living in their natural habitats.

Many of FAME's projects are aimed at native species 'on the brink' of extinction. Like the Thylacine before them, these native species often have little chance of survival and face the possibility of extinction. The Foundation for Australia's Most Endangered Species Limited (FAME) is dedicated to pushing back the staggering reality of endemic flora and fauna species extinctions occurring around Australia. It proudly focusses on projects conserving endangered species that, with the proper effort and conservation plan, have a high chance of success.

Over 25 years our strong track record of success is in essence a result of our careful research, good governance and extensive knowledge of conservation. In all, FAME has funded over 30 projects in the past 25 years. An incredible feat for such an agile company that continues to strengthen. There is so much more to do; our work may never be done.

FAME is a very practical organisation and collaborates with the private sector, public sector and not-for-profit enterprises to achieve the best possible results. Project partners are generally experts – the Foundation leaves the on-ground efforts to them while the Foundation backs them financially and provides support which would not otherwise be available.

A Bequest enables FAME to plan to help our precious native plants and animals. Funds from bequests are held in the Foundation's Investment Fund and applied thoughtfully to different areas where there is a conservation need, or alternately, to a project nominated in your Will.

Your Bequest, be it small, medium or large, to the Foundation will significantly strengthen the longevity and impact of FAME's work.

Leaving a Bequest - getting started

A Bequest simply means you include FAME as one of the beneficiaries in your Will.

Your solicitor can advise you about drafting an appropriate will from scratch or advise whether a Codicil, or addition to an existing Will, is appropriate.

We encourage you to seek legal advice from a solicitor with expertise in estate planning.

It is possible to specify that a Bequest be used for a particular purpose. However, priorities change over time, and it may be wise to request that the Board of FAME direct your gift to the area of greatest need when your gift becomes available.

There are many ways you can make a bequest in your will to FAME:

- a residual gift which is a share or whole of your estate after providing for family and friends,
- a percentage of the overall value of your estate which allows for growth or depreciation in the value of your estate,
- a specified sum of cash. However, this does not allow for changes of circumstance or inflation, or
- a gift of real estate, stocks, bonds, shares, artwork, jewellery etc.

Note: Acceptances of gifts in this category are subject to FAME's bequest policy.

Wording your will

According to your personal situation and your wishes for your legacy, the following wording could be used when including FAME in your will.

"I leave to the Foundation for Australia's Most Endangered Species Limited (ABN 79 154 823 579), free of all duties:

- All my residual estate (OR)
- ____% (percentage) of my residual estate (OR)
- The sum of \$_____ (OR)
- Nominated specific assets

to be applied for the purpose of saving Australian native wildlife from extinction OR for the purpose of _____[specify). I declare that the receipt by a Director or the Chief Executive Officer of FAME Ltd will be a sufficient discharge to my executor(s) who will not be bound to see the application of this gift."

Preparing a will

During the making of your will, we suggest you:

- obtain the consent of a trusted person to be the executor of your will,
- discuss your decisions regarding bequests outside the family with your executor, if appropriate,
- tell your family about your intentions to avoid misunderstandings later, and
- identify specific assets and possessions you want to give to particular beneficiaries.

Changing a will

Wills should be reviewed from time to time, and if necessary updated. Making changes is easy and inexpensive.

Useful Information

If you are aged over 18 and you do not currently have a will, please make one to ensure your wish to support native wildlife becomes a reality. Should you pass away intestate (without a will), the court will appoint an executor to administer your estate and the State Government will determine how it is to be distributed.

The Foundation's Legal and Tax Status

The Foundation for Australia's Most Endangered Species Limited (FAME) is an Australian company limited by guarantee and is registered with the Commonwealth Government. FAME is regulated by ASIC, the ATO and the Australian Charities and Not-for Profits Commission (ACNC).

Donations are received into FAME's Gift Fund, a public fund listed on the Register of Environmental Organisations under item 6.1.1 of sub section 30-55(1) of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

An impactful legacy - Dr Kwok Paul (Poh) Lee

Dr Lee was a practising Orthodontist in South Perth until the last year of his life. His great loves, apart cats, cooking and the Australian bush. Paul was deeply committed environmentally and lived his life through Karijini National Park (Western Australia) and the Ikara-Flinders Ranges (South Australia).



Weeds were always the biggest problem and in the early 1980s the management of the weeds became a bigger problem for production. However, I also became aware of the impact weeds were making on our native bush and individual species. Many affected the survival of our native animals, especially the smaller species.

My years on the SA Greening Australia Board built up my knowledge of our flora and then my introduction to FAME and service on the Board advanced my knowledge of our fauna.

I am confident that FAME will continue in the future to save and care for our special native plants and animals. I am supporting FAME in my Will and I ask you to consider to do so too.
